Many of you may be aware of the General Conference, an important meeting for our United Methodist Church that will take place in Charlotte, NC from April 23 – May 3, 2024. The General Conference, which meets every four years, is the official legislative body for our church. Delegates are clergy and laity from Annual Conferences around the world – including 12 from lowa. Through prayer and deliberation, the General Conference sets the rules in our *Book of Discipline*, and gives direction to the mission of the UMC.

In recent years, General Conference has been the focal point of heated debate about the future of the UMC – especially in relation to how we will include LGBTQ+ persons in our Christian family. Recent disaffiliation of some UMC congregations is related to this, resulting in some pastors and local churches leaving our connection. For those of us who are remaining in the UMC, the upcoming General Conference offers an opportunity



to reset our spirits, renew our relationships, and refocus our mission of making disciples of Jesus Christ.

One set of legislative measures before the delegates address the possibility of increasing Regionalization (already allowed in non-US Central Conferences) so that all areas of the church can adapt *Book of Discipline* rules to their local context for more effective ministry. This in turn may allow for Conferences in the United States to adopt more inclusive practices regarding LGBTQ+ marriage and ordination.

As the pastor here at Grace UMC, I want to encourage all of us to pray for the General Conference delegates and their work. I also counsel us to be patient. None of the potential changes will happen overnight – and we will have ample time to talk through the impact on of whatever is decided on our congregation and its ministry. Finally, I want to encourage you not to pay too much heed to news stories or inflammatory social media posts. Instead, look for official news from the General Conference or United Methodist News Service. As always, if you read or hear something and wish to talk about it, please let me know.



The library has a new look and many new books. Please stop in the library and "check it out"!


There is also a "Book Suggestion" card area. If you know of a book that may be great for our library, please complete a card located in the library.



Held at Grace United Methodist_Church our Camp Firelight VBS will welcome your students to enjoy an interactive, Bible-based good time on their summer camp adventure with God.

Students will be sorted into age groups and become Campers in one of our animal themed cabins, Chipmunks, Raccoons, Owls, and Foxes.

After a high-energy Opening Assembly time, the Campers make their way to the Bible Story Station. Interactive Bible lessons reveal each Firelight Focus to equip your Campers for an active life with God.

They will also discover our Firelight Focus (Bible memory verse), which will remain with them in their faith long after VBS. and hear about our mission project and as their respond to a call for action!


Our Sunday School Youth Students are reviewing Be Bold!
